Key Topic/Step 2: Prepare the Mixture

First, combine the half-n-half, granulated sugar, and vanilla extract in the small resealable bag. Release the excess air and seal the bag. Next, in the large resealable bag, combine the salt and ice. Place the small bag of mixture into the large bag and seal the large bag.

Now, shake vigorously for around 7 to 10 minutes, or until the ice cream has hardened. Remove the ice cream from the bag and scoop it into a bowl. Pair with your favorite toppings. You now have a delicious bowl of ice cream.
